Constitution

1. This Association shall be known as the Tarrant County Baptist Missionary Association.
2. This Association shall be composed of churches, by means of messengers that are members of, and elected by, the church sending them.
3. The officers of this Association shall consist of moderator, assistant moderator, clerk-treasurer, assistant clerk-treasurer.
4. It shall be the duty of this Association on the first day of each annual meeting to elect her officers for the following year.
5. New churches may be admitted to this fellowship on presentation of petitionary letters at the annual session of messengers sent from their church for such purpose, providing that on examination they be found to be in fellowship, in doctrine, faith, and practice with the churches of this Association. The moderator shall extend the right hand of fellowship to the messengers.
6. Each church shall be allowed five messengers.
7. It shall be the duty of the churches of this Association to provide a fund to defray expenses of the Association, including local missions, correspondence, and clerk hire.
8. It shall be the duty of each church in this Association to send a letter annually by her messengers, naming the messengers, the number of members received since the last Association, and how received, number dismissed and how. Also, the amount of funds sent in and for what purpose.
9. This Association shall have no power to lord over the churches, but shall function as an advisory council.
10. In all cases where there is difference between church or individuals of this Association, the same rule shall be observed as taught in Matthew 18 and other Scriptures corresponding therewith.
11. In the event of heresy in doctrine or unscriptural practice on the part of any church of this Association, having come to the notice of the Association, and after the Association has exhausted every scriptural effort to convert the church of the erroneous ways, it shall be the duty of the other churches of the Association to withdraw fellowship from the offending church.

12. This Association shall correspond with other associations of like faith and order as she may direct.
13. All matters coming before the Association shall be determined by will of the majority of the members present, except that of receiving churches, which shall be by unanimous vote. Associations that we correspond with shall be determined by a two-thirds majority.
14. No query shall be received by this Association until it shall have been taken up and elected upon by the church in which it originated. Then if the church fails to get satisfaction, it may be received.
15. This Association shall be governed by regular decorum.
16. As Baptists we do not hesitate to say that as it respects Missionary Institutions, we will not be bound to contribute to any, but will be left to act as the Word of God may lead us to do.
17. This Constitution may be changed, amended or altered at any regular meeting of the Association, by a two-thirds majority of messengers present.
18. This Association endorses the New Hampshire Confession of Faith as a representative compendium of what Baptist have historically believed through the centuries. We refer particularly to the edition in J. E. Cobb's *Church Manual* (third edition), published by the Baptist Publications Committee of Texarkana, Texas.
19. This Association shall meet annually at 9:30 AM on the third Saturday in September at such place as may be designated by the Association in annual session.
20. Newly elected officers shall not take over until the end of the annual meeting.

Rules of Decorum

1. The Association shall be opened with prayer.
2. All officers shall be chosen on the first day of the annual meeting by the messengers present.
3. The moderator shall be considered the judge of order, but any member shall have the right to rise to a point of order as they deem necessary.
4. Any member not satisfied with the moderator's ruling may appeal to the Association for a change on the same day; not later.
5. Only one person may speak at a time, after rising and addressing the moderator and getting recognition, then only shall he speak.
6. The speaker shall not be interrupted until he has given his light, unless he gets out of order, then shall he be called to order.
7. The speaker shall adhere to the subject and in no wise reflect on the ones who have spoken before, by remarking of his failings or the ones who have spoken before, by remarking of his failings or imperfections, but shall strictly present his idea of the matter at hand.
8. No appellation except that of Brother or Sister shall be used in the Association.
9. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the clerk and called as often as the Association may require.
10. The moderator may not interrupt any messenger, nor prohibit any member from speaking until he has given his light, except he be breaking the rule of the decorum.
11. The moderator shall be entitled to the same privilege of speech as any other provided the chair is filled, but shall not vote unless the Association is equally divided.
12. If any member shall knowingly and willingly break these rules, he or she shall be removed as the Association may think proper, This is to be done on the same day of the offense.

What a wonderful year of ministry we have enjoyed! *Baptist Progress*, now the informing and equipping ministry of the Baptist Missionary Association of Texas, hosted three Ministry Connection Workshops and an interim pastor training during the 2020-2021 associational year. CIRCULATION

Circulation for *Baptist Progress* stands at approximately 3,300 subscriptions. As always, we encourage each BMA of Texas church to join the *Baptist Progress* Church Plan. Each church on the Church Plan pays for the subscriptions to *Baptist Progress* of each member household in their congregation at a reduced rate.

For only \$1.75 per month (\$21 per year), per mail subscription, or \$1.25 per month (\$15 per year) per email subscription, churches can provide each of its member households with 12 issues of *Baptist Progress* for one year.

Individual mail subscriptions are \$24 per year and individual email subscriptions are \$18 per year.

EMAIL SUBSCRIPTIONS

In addition to publishing an issue every third Wednesday, *Baptist Progress* provides email

subscriptions with *e-News Updates* containing news and information on most weeks the paper is not published. News alerts, death announcements, important reminders and more are also emailed on a regular basis.

Those who subscribe to *Baptist Progress* by mail are encouraged to switch to an email subscription to take advantage of the extra news provided to email subscribers. Another advantage of having an email subscription is that you will receive news faster.

Hi everyone! As many of you know, TBHC has been around since 1910. Our mission and legacy have been caring for children of trauma. We began as an orphanage and have served almost 4,000 children since our inception. Our adoption program began in 2004 and has seen over 400 children adopted. We have an incredible team of staff who equip and challenge our licensed parents to provide quality care for all the children we serve.

Isaiah 43:19 says, "Behold, I will do a new thing. Now it shall spring forth; Shall you not know it? I will even make a road in the wilderness And rivers in the desert."

There are four things that I want you to remember about this verse and how it applies to TBHC's plans for the future. The first is the Lord is not work. He is doing something incredible and what's amazing is He is personally doing that work. It's also coming whether you're ready or not, so we need to be watching out for it and be aware that it's on its way. Finally, remember that God is going to do amazing things with scarcity from scarcity. He will bring abundance. God's going

to bless and if we want to be a part of what He's doing we need to be consciously aware and join Him in that work.

This year is a very special year for TBHC as we are launching two new facets of our ministry. The first being a brand-new office in Odessa and serving those in the Permian Basin. With only 14 percent of children in foster care staying in their county, we feel there is a great need for churches to step up and care for children. This office will make our third satellite office: Waxahachie, serving as headquarters; Bedford, our longest satellite office; Richardson, serving the north Dallas area; and now Odessa.

We are also beginning a new work in Waxahachie called Teen Pregnancy Care. We're excited for this ministry to serve teenagers who are caring for a beautiful baby and giving them both a hopeful future. For all the children we serve when their lives collide with God's grace, that's when beauty, hope and faith can happen.

Pray for our children in care. Serving them is how we bring glory to God. We recently began a podcast

called Bringing Kids Home. You can hear our latest episode by simply searching via the web or smartphone on any platform. It's an honor to tell stories of what it means to truly belong to a family and the challenges and the joys of adoption.

Last year we served 213 children in foster care with the daily number close to 100 every day. We had what I call the climax of our ministry with 20 children finding forever families through adoption. And the best number of all had 8 kids accept Jesus Christ as their savior and become a part of His eternal family.

Our plans are ambitious and will require God to provide immeasurably. If you're looking around and seeing God at work in our ministry, why not be a part of it in a big way. Your support helps us expand our influence so more kids might come to know Jesus.

We at the Baptist Missionary Loan Association (BMLA) are thankful for the opportunity to serve the churches of the BMA of Texas, and offer financial assistance to growing churches. The purpose of the BMLA becomes a reality when a loan is made. The BMLA assists churches with financial needs to purchase property, construct new buildings, remodel or add to existing buildings and refinance current loans. In the past associational year, the BMLA purchased four existing loans from BMA Texas Missions, provided five new loans and approved one refinance loan for a total of 10 loans. Other churches have indicated that they will be applying for loans in the near future.

Currently, we have over \$20 million in assets and are ready to provide your church with a loan. If your church plans to build, remodel or purchase property, it would be a joy to talk with you about a loan. There are three ways to financially support the Baptist Missionary Loan Association:

- 1) Any church or individual can simply make a contribution.
- 2) Any individual or church may make an interest free deposit. Interest deposits compound quarterly. As of Sept. 1, 2021, we continue to pay 2 percent on share accounts and 2.5 percent on Investment Certificates.
Note: Rates may change during the year

depending financial accepting new investors at this time because we want all investor dividends to be provided by our loans, not our investments so we do not have to depend on our financial investments. We should resume accepting new investors very soon. Call us to have your name added to our waiting list. The limit on new deposits does not apply to existing investors.

3) Churches may add the BMLA to their monthly budgets.

The BMLA trustees will recommend to the BMA of Texas in November that the BMLA begin providing loans not only to BMA churches in Texas, but also BMA churches across the United States.

Jacksonville College was established in 1899 and is the only remaining Christian Junior College in the state of Texas. The College's mission is to provide a quality education from a biblical worldview that challenges minds, transforms lives, and equips students for servant leadership and lifelong learning. Students earn Associate Degrees, Junior College Diplomas, and Continuing Education Units that are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). Additionally, many students are athletes and play on one of the College's twelve sports teams that compete in the NCAA. The student body consists of approximately five to six hundred students drawn by God from all over the state, nation, and world.

On April 29, 2021, the Board of Trustees unanimously voted to elect Dr. Joe Lightner as the President of Jacksonville College. Dr.

Lightner has a distinguished background in growing churches and serving as an executive leader in parachurch ministries. He holds a Master of Divinity from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, a Doctor of Ministry from Liberty University, and will complete a Doctor of Philosophy in Biblical Ministries from Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. He also has a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from the University of Arkansas and business experience that has strengthened the ministries he has served.

Joe is a gifted visionary, administrator, preacher, and evangelist who brings valuable experience that will contribute to the advancement of Jacksonville College's future. The nature of today's society indicates that unique challenges lie ahead for higher education, specifically Christian higher education.

To overcome these challenges, Jacksonville College will develop programming, processes, people, partners, and property accordingly.

These developments will require the kind of faith and sacrifice demonstrated in the "52 Day Campaign" conducted this summer.

The campaign was designed to prepare space for beds, classrooms, and offices to accommodate the highest projected enrollment in recent history. Many staff, alumni, partners and churches participated in the campaign to help renovate the following buildings: Collins Hall, Gerald Orr Music Annex, Mary Nell and Summers A. Norman Library, Joe Wright Elementary, and C. R. Meadows, as well as renovation to the majority of the residential houses.

The gratitude expressed by returning students has been rewarding. Jacksonville College is a special place where a student can receive a quality education and experience spiritual transformation. Continued faith and sacrifice will keep Jacksonville College special for the years to come.
